

The Kids Clinic Vaccination Policy

The pediatricians at The Kids Clinic firmly believe in the effectiveness of vaccines in preventing serious illness and saving lives. We firmly believe in the safety of our vaccines. All children and young adults should receive all of the recommended vaccines according to the schedule published by the [American Academy of Pediatrics](#).

Vaccinating children and young adults may be the single most important health-promoting intervention we provide as healthcare providers, and that you can provide as parents/caregivers. The recommended vaccines and their administration schedule are the result of years of scientific study and data collected from millions of children by thousands of our brightest scientists and physicians.

For these reasons, The Kids Clinic expects all parents to vaccinate their children in a comprehensive and timely way according to the recommended primary and preschool vaccination schedules, as recommended by the [American Academy of Pediatrics](#).

In the case of specific vaccines recommended but not required for school enrollment, such as those to prevent COVID, Influenza, and Human papillomavirus, parents can expect that we will encourage them to consider providing these vaccinations for their child. We will discuss the safety and benefits of these vaccines.

While we are happy to answer questions and discuss the safety and efficacy of the vaccines we offer, for families who choose not to have their child complete the primary and preschool vaccination schedule outlined above, we will ask you to find another healthcare provider who shares your views. We do not keep a list of such providers, nor would we recommend any such physician.

Please recognize that we believe that by not vaccinating, you are putting your child at unnecessary risk for life-threatening illness and disability, and even death. As medical professionals, we feel very strongly that vaccinating your child on schedule with currently available vaccines is absolutely the right thing to do to protect all children and young adults.
